



**SENATE**

**SB 129 – Compassionate Care for Rape Victims Bill**

*NPCW Position: Support the Bill*  
(Passed 27-6)

Requires hospitals to inform rape victims about emergency contraception and dispense upon request to prevent pregnancy after an assault

**SB 232 SA1 – Birth Control Protection Act Table Senate Amendment 1**

*NPCW Position: Support Tabling*  
(Passed 21-12)

Would have allowed individual pharmacists to violate their professional code of ethics and refuse to fill women’s legal birth control prescription based on moral objections

**SB 232 – Birth Control Protection Act**

*NPCW Position: Support the Bill*  
(Passed 19-14)

Requires pharmacists dispense birth control without delay when presented with a legal prescription. Also, ensures birth control will never be included in the legal definition of abortion

**Pro = Voted for the NPCW Position**  
**Anti = Voted against the NPCW Position**  
**NV = Did Not Vote**

**AB 710 AA1 – Abortion Procedure Ban Assembly Amendment 1**

*NPCW Position: Support Amendment (Failed 54-43)*

This amendment would have ensured that if abortion becomes illegal in Wisconsin, there would be an exception if a woman’s health is at risk.

**AB 710 AA2 - Abortion Procedure Ban Assembly Amendment 2**

*NPCW Position: Support Amendment (Failed 54-43)*

This amendment would have ensured that if abortion became illegal in Wisconsin, there would be an exception in the case of rape and incest.

**AB 710 – Abortion Procedure Ban**

*NPCW Position: Oppose Bill*

*(Passed: 59-38)*  
Outlawed an abortion procedure doctors consider safest for some women with particular high-risk medical conditions. Did not pass Senate.
